

Another thing is that people were surprised that the teacher of Emerald, Mrs.Green, did not cry (because she cries every time she reads the story in class!).


Books you should check out


The Legend of Kevin by Philip Reeve is a book where Max finds a flying pony and the pony is hurt so he brings him into his house.
